



Humor is FUNdamental to Providing Quality Education and Care to Young Children

Paul McGhee, Ph.D. is currently the President of The Laughter Remedy in Wilmington, Delaware. His scientific contributions to the field of humor research make him unique among professional speakers discussing the importance of building more humor into your life. He spent 20 years conducting basic research on humor and laughter before becoming a professional speaker and is generally viewed as a pioneer in the field.

This keynote shows how humor helps cope with the stress associated with teaching or caring for young children and helps teachers to continue to provide quality education and care day after day — even on their toughest days. It is entertaining and fun and guaranteed to get you laughing, but also discusses substantive issues related to the education and care of young children.
